THREE STATE HIGH SCHOOL RECORDS ARE LOWERED

Lewis, Valley Falls, Beats Discus Mark 8 Feet, 10 Inches.

McPherson Wins Meet With 20 Points; Valley Falls, 19, Second; Eskridge, 10, Third.

Manhattan, Kan., May 8.—(Special)—Three state high school records were broken in the annual state track meet here this afternoon. McKnown, of Pratt, broke the record he established last year in the pole vault when he cleared the bar at 11 feet, 0 1/2 inches. His record last year was 11 feet, 2 inches. Clapp, of Logan, clipped off one second from the former state record when he trotted the half mile in 2 minutes, 53-5 seconds. Lewis, of Valley Falls, hurled the discus 120 feet, one inch. The former record was 111 feet, three inches.

McPherson won the meet by scoring 20 points. Valley Falls was second with 19 and Eskridge third with 10. Points made by other high schools are: Pratt, 9 1/2; Minneapolis, 8; Norton, 6; Pittsburg, 7; Elmdale, 5; Ellsworth, 5; Topeka, 5; Kansas City, 5; Logan, 5; Norway, 5; Newton, 5; Salina, 4 1/2; Emporia, 4; Osage City, 4; Fort Scott, 3; Abilene, 2; Hutchinson, 2; Luray, 2; Scott City, 2.
